A SURVIVAL SKILL

From time to time, there is conflict amongst the children or confusion about school expectations. This is inevitable. This is part of the education and personal growth journey. Staff deal with such matters regularly. This is their job.

But what sometimes happens is that we the staff are unaware of a concern which is reported directly by a child to their parent. Naturally, the parent only gets one side of the story. This is sometimes followed by intense conversations between parent and staff.

(In this eventuality, we do ask parents to address their concerns to a principal or vice-principal rather than to a junior or casual or volunteer teacher).

But what is far more beneficial to the children is that they learn to take their concern directly to a teacher or the principal. Children who are willing and able to speak up for themselves will obviously survive secondary school (and beyond) better than those who can only communicate their concerns to their parent.

This school is about communication skills and self-confidence. Therefore, in the situation that a child is asking for an adult response to a problem, we urge parents to urge children to take their matter to a staff member.

If a child feels that the staff have not responded adequately to their expressed concerns, the option still of course exists to ask their parent to take the matter up with staff.
